




The system then crashed. The student, Charley Kline, had tried to type "Login." It worked on the second try.



Sir Tim Berners-Lee made a proposal for an information management system on 12 March 1989, and he implemented the first successful communication between a **Hypertext Transfer Protocol** (HTTP) client and server via the internet in mid-November the same year.


Today's browsers support

Browser compatibility issues can be a problem. Since browsers use different rendering engines, websites may not appear the same across multiple browsers.

The primary function of a web browser is to render HTML, the code used to design or "mark up" webpages.








Only business users --- not consumers --- will have the option to prevent the update and keep the current Edge browser. Without a browser, here is what a web page looks like.





Services like Netflix, Hulu, and Amazon Video are the most well-known names in what's become known as "cord cutting"—doing away with pay TV to get all your "television" programming via internet streaming services (or, in some cases, over the airwaves). Cord cutting means no more paying a huge monthly fee for thousands of hours of TV you don't watch (in theory). Instead, you pay individual services for a la carte programming. It's a lot like paying for just what you watch. Almost.

According to <u>eMarketer</u>, pay TV will have about 72.7 million subscribers in the US by 2023—down from 100.5 million in 2015. In Q2 2019 alone, pay-TV providers lost 1.53 million customers, <u>Leichtman Research</u> says.

What's ironic is, pay-TV providers don't always lose those customers entirely, because more are also ISPs. Companies like Comcast, Charter, and Altice are weathering the pay-TV subscriber loss easily because people need them for breadband. Cookies

- Very small text files placed on your computer by a web server
- Not all websites place cookies
- Web server doesn't have to repeatedly request this information, potentially slowing download time.

What does a cookie look like?

It will usually be named something like abc@example.com.txt. If you were to open one of these files, it would just look like some random numbers.

HMP1 1 example.com/ 0 4058205869 384749284 403847430 3449083948 *

The strings of numbers are codes which are only meaningful to the software that generated it. Usually it is little more than a unique identifying string, although sometimes they are used for data-storage.

Either way, there is usually nothing meaningful to find when viewing a cookie file.

Cookies store personal registration data

- Your name
- Your address
- The contents of a shopping cart
- Your preferred layout for a web page
- What map you might be looking at
- And so on

Cookies make it easy for web servers to personalize information to fit your specific needs and preferences when you're visiting a web site.
